HOW MANY WOMEN ARE MISSING?

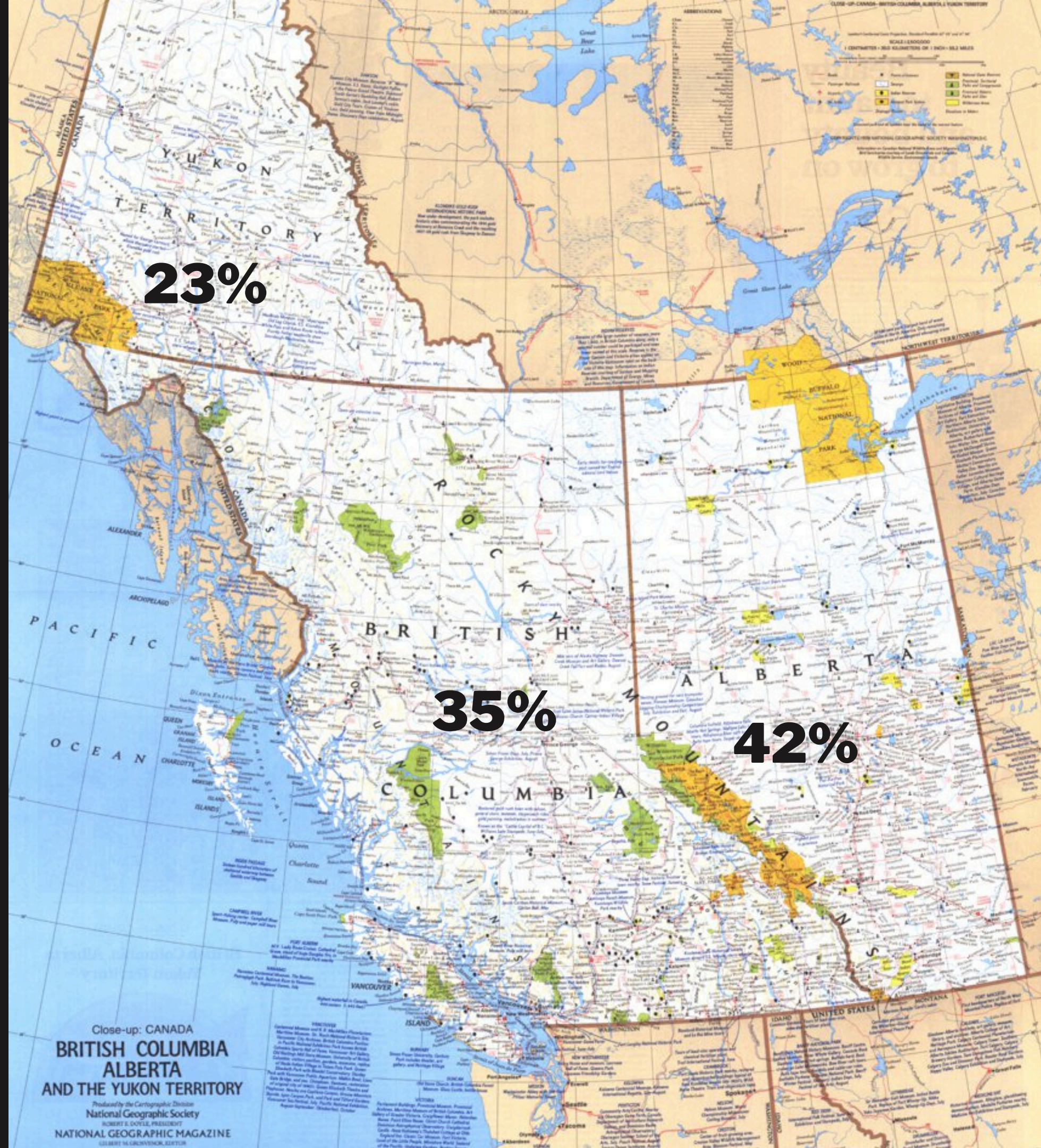
As of March 31, 2010 in British Columbia there are 582 suspected cases, only 193 of which are completed court cases and only 307 profiles of missing women and girls in the missing persons data base. Out of those cases

- 67% are murders (389)
- 20% are missing women and girls (116)
- 4% are suspected natural or accidental death (24)
- 9% the nature is unknown (52)

The MMIWG human rights issue affects all Aboriginal women and girls including but not limited to First Nations, Metis, and Inuit.

WHERE DO THEY GO MISSING FROM?

In British Columbia, Highway 16, otherwise known as “The Highway of Tears” is a 725 Km corridor between Prince George and Prince Rupert . They also go missing from neighboring provinces such as the Yukon and Alberta. The issue is not limited to Canada and even reaches into the United States of America. Women also go missing from an area of BC known as the British Columbia Triangle 4/6 this is an area in the northern Okanagan.

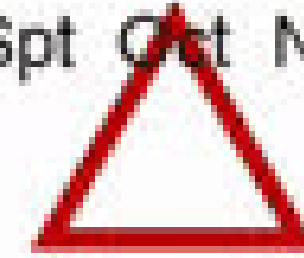
The *Native Hope* website notes that in Canada 23% of reported cases Western Canada occur in the Yukon, 35% occur in British Columbia, and 42% of cases are in Alberta.

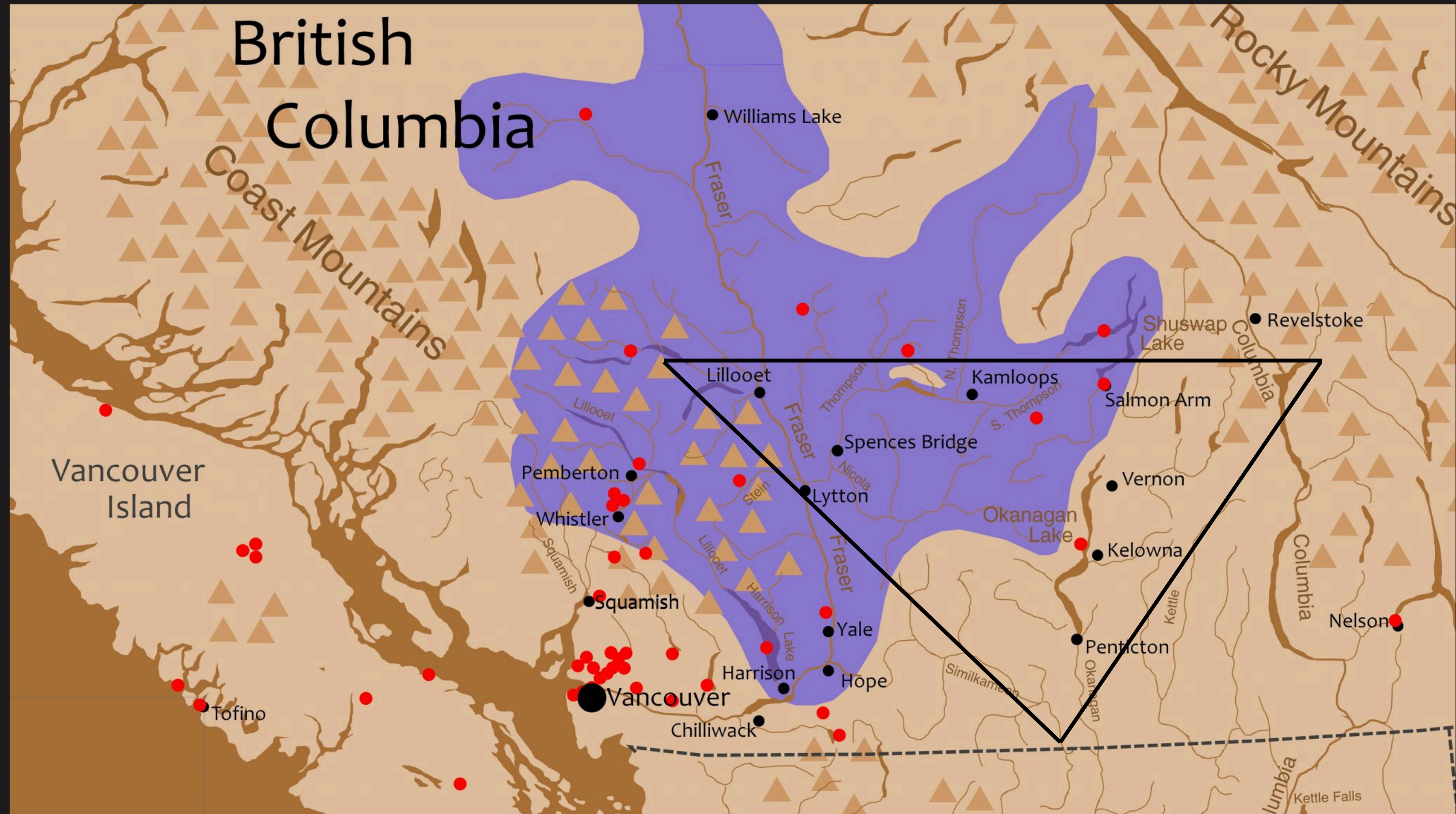

Triangle 4/6 are hotspots of unsolved missing person cases in the interior plateau of BC. At each point of the triangle, the disappearances increase. The point stretches from the Washington border, towards the Okanagan and Lillooet areas in BC.

HIGHWAY 16

The Highway of Tears, or highway 16, is a 725 km long stretch of highway between Prince George and Prince Rupert. Along the highway are 23 First Nations Communities. It is called The Highway of Tears because over 100 women and girls have gone missing on the highway. Highway 16 has very few travelers and very little cell service.

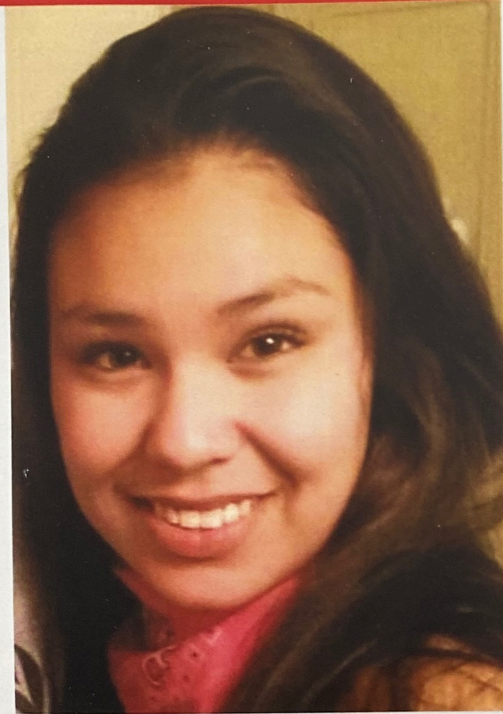
E-PANA



Since 2006, E-Pana has been dedicated to cold cases along 720 km along Highway 16 (Highway of Tears). 70 investigators were originally part of E-PANA and in 2016 only 8 were left. Indigenous elders say at least 50 girls have either been murdered or gone missing since the 70's. E-Pana originally took on 9 of those cases and eventually expanded into 18 open cases, and turned 700 boxes of old police records into their database. Officers identified a man suspected of committing three murders but he is now dead. Another Man, Gary Taylor Handlen has been charged with the murder of Monica Jack in 2014. Monica Jack was a 12-year-old indigenous girl last seen riding her bike along the Highway of Tears in 1978 and she was not found until 1995.

She got a ride home to Terrace to celebrate Thanksgiving on October 6, 1995, dropped off her belongings at her family's home, and continued on to her cousin's house for the evening. She hung out with friends that evening and was last seen at 3:30 am on October 7, 1995. The RCMP have tips that she was possibly seen along Highway 16 and got into a car with two men.

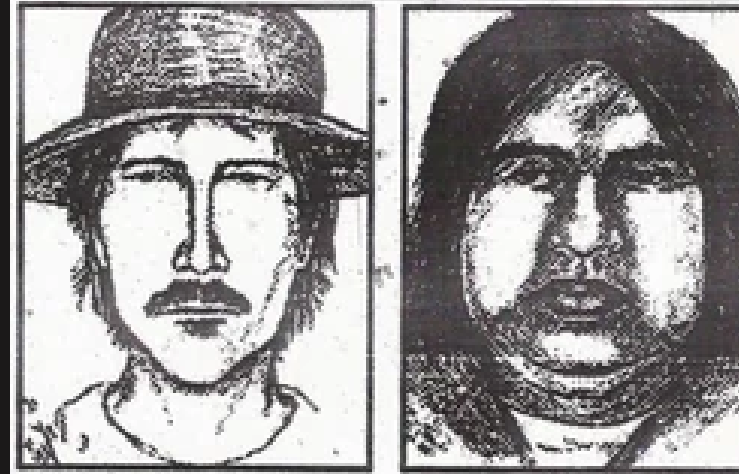

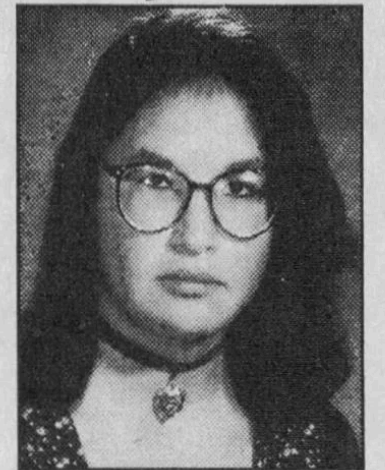

Mom fears for missing student, 19

A team of five Terrace Mounties is trying to determine the whereabouts of college student Lana Patricia Derrick.

The 19-year-old woman vanished after going out with friends on Oct. 6.

Marjorie Haugan, Derrick's mother, made a tearful plea yesterday for anyone with information about her daughter to call police.

"I can't express my feelings," said Haugan. "Every time I think about her I'm in tears — I'm hoping she can get to a phone and call home."

Derrick, a forestry student at a college in Houston, deposited her books at her parents' home on the morning of Oct. 6 before joining friends in Terrace. She was to spend the night with her friends and join her family for an early Thanksgiving dinner on the weekend.

But police say she disappeared without a trace after leaving a friend's home in downtown Terrace at about 3:30 a.m., Saturday, Oct. 7.

"She would always call," her mother insisted.

"Her disappearance is abnormal," said RCMP Staff Sgt. John Veldman.

Derrick is a native Indian with shoulder-length black hair and brown eyes. She

wears glasses, is five feet, seven inches tall and weighs 150 pounds.

■ In Abbotsford, police hunting the killer of Tanya Smith, 16, have cancelled an annual regimental dinner for tomorrow so people don't get the impression officers are partying while citizens fret about their safety.

■ RCMP are seeking help in identifying the body of a woman found naked in a wooded area 30 kilometres east of Mission last Saturday.

The woman is described as petite, brown-haired and has a small heart-shaped tattoo on her left wrist. She is between 20 and 40 and was wearing a small copper bracelet. Her murder may be tied to the deaths of two prostitutes whose bodies were found near Agassiz.

Background: Member of the Wet'suwet'en First Nation in Smithers, B.C. On June 13, 1990, Delphine told her uncle that she was going to meet up with friends in town. The group wandered around town for the day and ended up at the Mohawk gas station on Highway 16 once evening approached. At this point, Delphine called her uncle to let him know that she was heading home. Delphine was last spotted hitchhiking on Highway 16. The clerk at the Mohawk gas station told police that they had seen her get into a red sports car. Jack Fowler, an American serial killer that was active along this stretch of highway during this time, was a suspect in Delphines disappearance but there was never proof to charge him.

Highway of Tears toll doubles to 18

RCMP investigators also expand geographical scope to include other major highways in B.C.

The RCMP announced Friday it has expanded its Highway of Tears investigation in northern B.C. to include 18 young women who were murdered or went missing since 1969, doubling the number of files being probed.

Investigators met Thursday with families of the murdered and missing women before making the announcement.

The expanded probe includes an unsolved murder that took place in Prince George last year and another unsolved murder dating back 38 years.

The geographical scope was also expanded to include unsolved cases along other major highways in B.C., including those leading to Hudson's Hope, Kamloops, Merritt, 100 Mile House and extending as far as Hinton, Alta.

Last year, the police probe listed nine women between the ages of 14 and 25 who were murdered or missing along Highway 16, a desolate two-lane road that runs from Prince Rupert to Prince George and on to Edmonton.

It was dubbed the Highway of Tears because of the grief caused by a string of unsolved murders and mysterious disappearances over the years.

Short Description: She was known for her bright smile, her love for her family, and her dreams of a better future

Identifying Marks: Tina Fontaine was a young Indigenous girl from Sagkeeng First Nation in Manitoba, Canada. Tina Fontaine was reported missing on August 9, 2014, at the age of 15. She was last seen in downtown Winnipeg, where she had been living temporarily. Despite efforts by her family and authorities to locate her, Tina remained missing for several days. In December 2015, the Winnipeg Police Service charged Raymond Cormier, 53, with second-degree murder in Fontaine's death. He pleaded not guilty.

The Crown offered no forensic evidence or eyewitnesses to directly connect Cormier to Fontaine's death. The largely circumstantial case hinged on the suspect's statements secretly recorded during a police sting operation. Although the defence did not present any evidence, Cormier's lawyer Tony Kavanagh said in his closing remarks that because the jury could not confirm that Fontaine died as a result of an unlawful act, Cormier should be acquitted "on that alone."

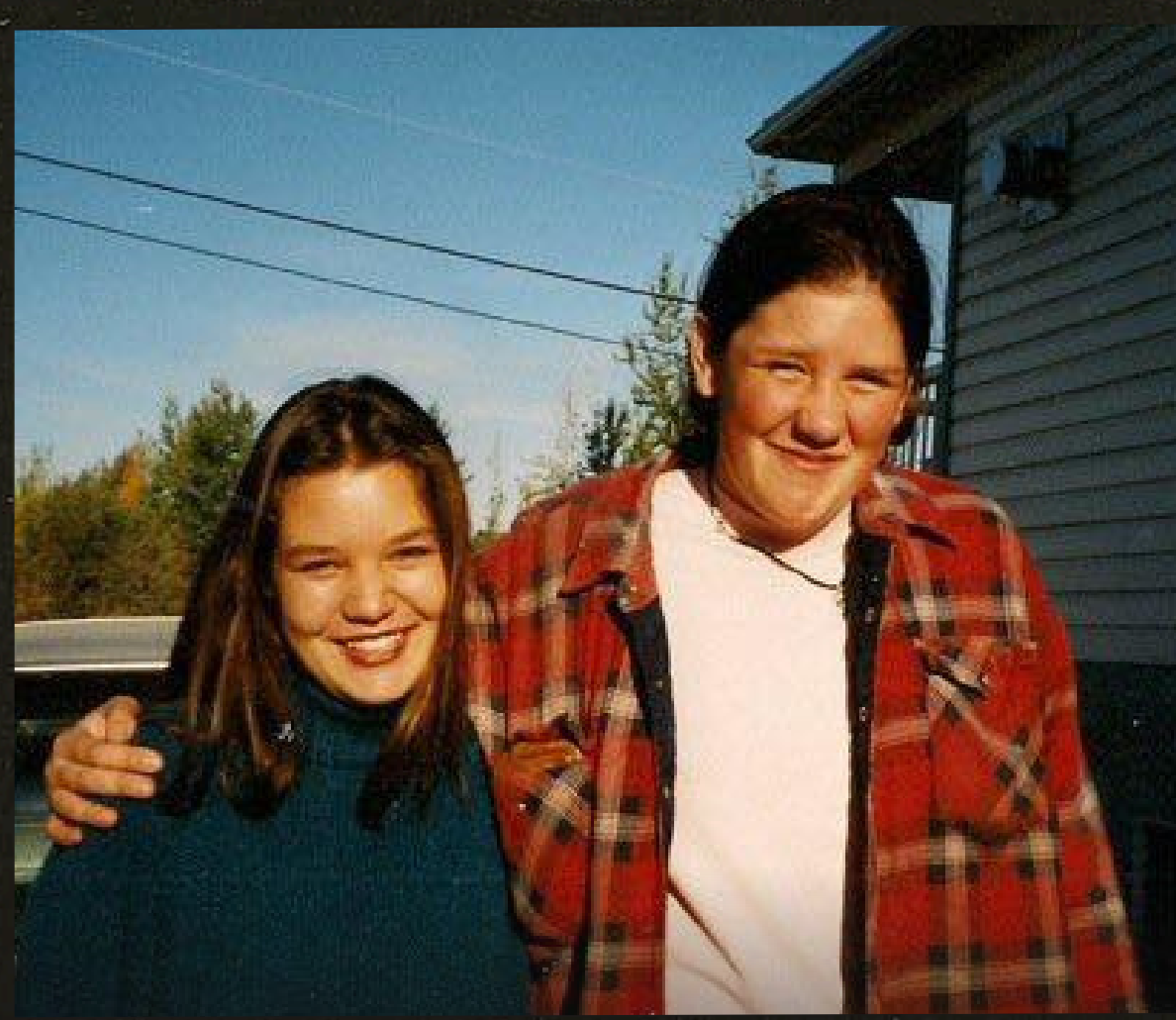

Description: Long, Straight, dark brown or black hair, Brown eyes, Pierced earlobe, dark in complexion, thin built, Two dolphins are tattooed on her lower back and she recently did a surgery for a broken ankle that wasn't completely healed when she disappeared.

Identifying Marks: Lisa Marie Young was from Nanaimo, British Columbia, Canada. She was known for her outgoing personality, her love for her family and friends, and her passion for life. She was described as caring, compassionate, and adventurous. **In late July 2002, police questioned the driver of the Jaguar. Young's mother was taken by RCMP to a short meeting with the driver. She later stated that she asked the man to tell her where her daughter was, and he replied, "I can't.... I'm sorry, I don't mean to disrespect your family." The Jaguar was eventually located, seized by RCMP for inspection, and later released. It was determined that the car was owned by the driver's grandmother, who subsequently sold the Jaguar, and threatened to sue over that could implicate her grandson in the disappearance. Police did not begin searching for Young until she had been missing for two months, "leaving the job for relatives and friends to do on their own.**



Abigal was a Metis women, she was an expecting mother but was not showing yet. She loved to travel and spent a few years in England and Montreal. Friends described her as sweet, innocent, heart on her sleeve, as the sweetest most giving, generous person. She would have turned 41 in February 2024 and her child would be 13.

Bonnie Marie Joseph is a 32-year-old Indigenous woman from the Yekooche Band near the Fort Saint James area, specifically from the Kuzche Reservation. Bonnie Marie Joseph is a mother of five. Bonnie was last seen on September 8th, 2007, hitchhiking from Vanderhoof to Prince George which is about an hour away, and along the highway of tears.

Nobody reported Bonnie missing until December 2007, her disappearance is still unsolved there are no suspects and nobody has been held accountable.

Aielah was a Lheidli T'enneh Indigenous girl, from Edmonton Alberta. Aielah was the youngest of six siblings in a tight-knit family. In 2004 Her family moved to Prince George BC where her older brother lived. Aielah was a grade eight student at D.P. Todd Secondary School in Prince George. Aielah was last seen on February 2nd, 2006. The day she went missing, she and some of her siblings went to the mall and then went to have a sleepover at a friend's house. After not coming home the next day, her mother tried to report her missing on Feb 3rd. However, because of the 78-hour waiting period was not officially declared missing until February 6th. On February 10th a passerby found her body in a ditch just off Highway 16 or the Highway of Tears. Her story is currently being investigated by E-PANA a task force, investigating the connection of the murders occurring along Highway 16. Her story remains unsolved. No one has been held accountable for her disappearance and death.

NAME: RAMONA WILSON
AGE: 16 YEARS OLD
MISSING DATE: JUNE 11 1994
LOCATION: SMITHERS, BC
CASE STATUS: UNSOLVED MURDER

Ramona was a part of the Gitksan Nation and was described as an energetic and vivacious person. She had a wonderful sense of humour and was popular among her peers. Ramona was excited to attend a graduation party in her town and left the house at 9:45 PM to meet with her good friend Kristal. When Ramona failed to show up to the party, Kristal assumed Ramona had made alternate plans with her boyfriend. When no one had seen or heard from Ramona, her mother; Matilda, reported her missing to the RCMP. The officers were less than sympathetic and suggested to Matilda to “give it some time” or that she “probably ran off” only to discover that there was no contact with any of her friends, relatives, or work. They launched an investigation two days later. Tragically, in a town North of the Highway of Tears on April 9th, 1995, some boys stumbled across Ramona’s body. They were playing rugby at a popular spot among teenagers and found her bound in rope and cables with her clothes scattered nearby. The RCMP claimed to have a few leads that led to nowhere, leaving the murder unsolved.

Chelsey was a part of the Saik'uz First Nation community and described by her mother as "Independent, educated, and a hard-working woman. She's loving and caring". Chelsey was an incredibly hard worker and obtained a job at the Houston Mill as a Level three First Aid Attendant. Before her disappearance, she had moved back to live with her father and siblings on the Saik'uz First Nations Territory. On October 11th 2023 around 2 AM, Chelsey stepped outside, presumably for a cigarette break, but she never returned. When she did not respond to any calls or texts, her family reported her missing to the Vanderhoof Police Department. Sadly, on November 6, 2023, Chelsey's body was found in a wooded area near her home on the reserve, off Highway 16. The investigation is still ongoing, and as of now, no further details have been disclosed.



Nicole was from Alberta and was working in Prince George.

She was last seen hitchhiking on highway 16 to Smithers.
